NOTICE FOR ALL INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

Any competitions other than those covered in the Rules for Driving Events must be approved by the FEI before they may be added to the schedule

Schedules for CAI-A4,2,1/CAIP-A4,2,1/CAI-B4,2,1/CAIP-B4,2,1 and Championships are approved by the FEI.

Schedules for these events must be sent to the FEI Secretariat for approval by the NF concerned, at least 16 weeks before the event is due to take place.

Definite schedules must be sent to the FEI Secretariat by the NFs concerned at least 4 weeks before the event takes place.

Final approval of the draft schedule by the FEI, in accordance with Art. 115.1, denotes only that the contents conform to the FEI Statutes, General Regulations and Rules. By no means does this entail implicit acceptance of any liability by the FEI for any damages to third parties caused by the Organising Committee and its officials, riders, drivers, owners, and their horses.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

IX. MISCELLANEOUS

1. PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

2. DISTRIBUTION OF PRIZES AND INDEMNITIES (Art. 130)

All placed competitors have to take part in the prize giving ceremony. All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 130.2 following the last competition at the latest. Settlement will be done per competitor. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each competitor binds himself, to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the competitor. Acc. to § 50a Abs.4 this also applies to foreign horse owners.

3. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

All payments will be made according to Dutch law and tax regulations. Those foreign competitors being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every competitor himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

4. INSURANCES

The Organiser, the Organising Committee and all persons working for the Organiser shall not be liable for any material or physical damage, accident or illness which may occur to owners, competitors, horses and grooms, under any circumstances, within or out of the competition ground before, during or after the competitions. The Organiser, the Organising Committee and all persons working for the Organiser shall not be liable for damage to driving vehicles, stable attachment and other property (including theft and loss).

The competitor indemnifies the Organiser, the Organising Committee and all persons working for the Organiser from liability with regard to claims made by third parties, including the owners of the horses, for compensation by the Organiser, the Organising Committee and all persons working for the Organiser for all material or physical damage, of whatever nature, suffered by these third parties.

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

5. LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, competitors, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. He also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or incidents.

6. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.

7. CANCELLATION OF THE EVENT (acc. To art. 115.1 and 2 of gen.reg.)

If special circumstances demand, the Organising Committee reserves the right to take all necessary action including the cancellation of the event by repaying the entry fee, with the approval of the Secretary General of the FEI.
